10 Things to Do when riding Motorcycles in a Group

1. Be prepared when you arrive at the ride starting point.

- 2. Know what Hand Signals you are going to use or be prepared to compare and use the other riders hand signals.
- 3. Conduct a Safety Brief before the ride.
- 4. Select an experienced rider to lead the ride and another experienced rider in the rear.
- 5. Keep your group size manageable. You may have more riders (or a larger group) on the interstate and smaller groups in town or in heavier traffic.
- 6. Staggered formations are always best because they allow more room for bikes and trikes can fall into the formation anywhere.
- 7. Watch out for each other during a ride. Make sure everyone is drinking enough water, not forgetting their medications or when they might need a break.
- 8. Have plan if someone breaks down or needs to stop. The entire group does not need to pull over, block traffic and cause a hazard. Designate a rider in the rear to stop and check on the person that stopped.
- 9. Have a plan if someone needs to leave the group while enroute. If you or someone is leaving the group early, have a plan on how to signal that you are leaving the group, so everyone knows.
- 10. Don't let the group ride at a higher level than the new riders and don't forget that the large touring bikes may have a lot more range than smaller or sport bikes. You may need to ride slower and stop more frequently depending on your group.

Wherever you ride, plan a safe trip & keep your loved ones posted.

Moonshine Road Trip

May 19 – 22, 2022; In preparation for the trip, I strongly recommend that you watch the NETFLIX movie LAWLESS which is based on a true story of the Bondurant Brothers from Franklin County, Virginia. To this day Franklin County is considered "The Wettest County in the World". Also search the internet on the Bondurant Brothers and Junior Johnson from Wilkes County, North Carolina. Johnson's "moonshine running" lead to the birth of NASCAR. Wilkes County, NC is considered "The Moonshine Capital of the

World". Remember the song "Tom Dooley".... he too was from Wilkes County, NC. and was tried, convicted and hanged for murdering Laura Foster. So, you can see this is going to be a great ride. Here is a possible itinerary (not etched in stone):

- Leave Harrison County on May 19th ride through Elkins/Monterey/Staunton and get the Blue Ridge Parkway.... this is about 200 miles
- Ride 120+ miles on the Blue Ridge to the Rocky Mount, VA exit and do a brief stop at Rocky Mount the area where the Bondurant Brothers was from. (50 miles)
- Ride another 50 miles to Wilkesboro, NC where Junior Johnson, the Call Family and a few others made and ran their moonshine. Possible overnighter here.
- Visit some of the attractions including the Call Family Distillery and ride some of the moonshine runner roads. End up at the Junior Johnson Distillery in Madison, NC. Maybe (150 miles).
- From there head back north stopping at the Bondurant Brothers Distillery in Chase City, Virginia. (100 miles).
- Head Home on Sunday by riding through Lewisburg, WV. (350 miles)

Note: Not sure where we will overnight.... will leave that up to the group as we ride along. Let me know if you are interested and I'll set up a pre-ride get to gather.
